The solar eclipse is coming soon and will be an amazing sight. As we view this marvel, we can remember the One who made it all happen. The creator of the sun and the moon is also our creator. The God who brought the universe into being also brings us life and loves us with an unconditional, steadfast love. Let's enjoy the show that the sun and moon give us on April 8, but let's also give thanks to God who made it all possible. The heavens declare God's glory and so should we.

Details:

On April 8 Jacksonville will experience 2 minutes and 31 seconds of totality. This will be the first time since August 21, 2017 that the United States had a view of a solar eclipse. The one before that was in 1979 and the next one will be in 2044. It will begin at 12:33 pm and totality will begin at 1:52. Be sure to wear solar glasses!

Depending on your surroundings, as totality nears you may experience strange things. You'll notice a resemblance to the onset of night, though not exactly. Shadows will appear differently. Usually, any breeze will dissipate and birds (many of whom will return to roost) will stop chirping. A 10°F to 15°F drop in temperature may occur.



Study materials for the class will be provided. We need to know how many workbooks to print. A sign-up sheet will be posted. You can also call the church office.



"Witness to the Resurrection" Planning Workshop April 21

The resurrection is a central doctrine of the Christ faith and shapes Christian's attitudes and responses to the event of death. Death brings loss, sorrow and grief to all. In the face of death Christians affirm with tears and joy the hope of the gospel. Christians do not bear bereavement in isolation but are sustained by the power of the Sprit and the community of faith. The church offers a ministry of love and hope to all who grieve.

Death and end of life planning are topics most of us would rather avoid. Whether it is our own death or the death of a loved one, the idea of loss and the pain or separation cause us to avoid the subject. As a result, few of us have plans in place for end of life. Those plans include preparation of legal and financial documents, expressing wishes for our healthcare in times of incapacity, and even plans for funerals and memorial services. We want to spare our loved ones such difficult conversations,. Unfortunately, it is often our very avoidance of the topic today that can later lead to increased emotional and spiritual stress on those we leave behind.

Because it is difficult to plan wisely under emotional stress, the church encourages members to discuss and plan in advance the arrangements which will be necessary at the time of death. Planning for what is inevitable for all human being can be a significant spiritual experience for you and also a gift of love for your family and friends.

As part of our shared ministry of care and nurture for one another in Christian community the church will offer a planning workshop on April 21 after the Community Potluck. In this "Witness to the Resurrection" workshop you will have an opportunity to think about, plan, and receive checklists for you to use so that your family will know your wishes. As you reflect upon your life, may you embrace even more deeply the love of God we know in Jesus Christ.
