
We remember and celebrate the life and memory of Ron, a devoted husband, father, grandfather, and friend, whose generosity and warmth touched everyone who knew him.

Ron's Pecan Pie Recipe

"Every holiday season, and almost anytime someone asked, Ronald would bake his signature pecan pie—nearly 60 pies each Thanksgiving and Christmas. He called it the Appalachian Pecan Pie, but to us, it's more fitting to simply call it "Quiz Pecan Pie." This recipe makes two pies, and in true Ron fashion, we ask that you share the second pie with someone else. Ron believed in showing love through the warmth of good food, and we hope his legacy of generosity and loving others through their stomachs will continue with each pie baked.

6 eggs, large or extra large 1½ cups packed brown sugar

1 ½ cups clear syrup

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 ½ tablespoon melted butter
Do not use a mixer (hand stir)
You can be creative with the
pecans, be sure they are coated
with the mix if you are placing them,
if you like. Mix chopped pecans in
the mix. The pies don't cut well if
you cover them with pecan halves. I
dump a handful of chopped in the
center and tap them under with fork
after I place the halves around the
outer edge

Bake at 350° for 50 to 60 minutes, low in the oven."
