
Good News

Looking ahead-Lent begins March 2

This year, we're letting the Gospel of Luke guide us through Lent. Beginning with Jesus setting his face toward Jerusalem (Luke 9:51), this worship series flows through several familiar stories—the Good Samaritan, Mary and Martha, the fruitless fig tree, the Lost Sheep, Zacchaeus, and more. Many of these stories are well-known in both sacred and secular imagination and hold significance in pop culture, church history, politics, and everything in between. Our theme, "Everything In Between," invites us to navigate the polarities in our lives with more faith, intention, and openness to be transformed. You will see that each weekly sub-theme explores two supposed binaries, like "faith & works" or "rest & growth," or "grief & hope." We often consider these ideas to be opposing. However, as we explore these concepts within the scriptures, we find nuance and complexity. We find that these dichotomies are false. We might begin to see a full spectrum instead of black and white. We might find that God is present in between.

Jacksonville Warming Center By the Numbers

Our fellowship hall has been used 16 evenings and nights in December and January. We had between 17 and 30 people stay each night.

28 people volunteered for an entire shift. 13 people volunteered for a few hours.

12 organizations and 12 individuals brought food and other items.

We especially want to thank Karen Finney who organized this ministry. We are sharing the love of God by providing shelter for those who would otherwise be out in the cold on those frigid nights.
